### **Free Legal Research Resources**

#### Google Scholar (https://scholar.google.com)

Google Scholar allows you to search and read published opinions of US state appellate and supreme court cases since 1950, US federal district, appellate, tax and bankruptcy courts since 1923, and US Supreme Court cases since 1791. It also includes a variety of other select legal resources.

#### Justia (https://www.justia.com)

Justia provides free access to a large variety of legal information, including cases, organized by jurisdiction and subject area. It includes databases of legal blogs has a blog of its own, Verdict, with analysis of current legal issues.

#### Legal Information Institute (https://www.law.cornell.edu)

This is Cornell Law's collection of free legal material which includes unofficial full-text copies of Supreme Court opinions, federal court rules, the *U.S. Code*, and the *Code of Federal Regulations*. The Legal Encyclopedia section provides a starting place for researching legal topics.

Library of Congress Guide to Law Online (https://www.loc.gov/law/help/guide.php)

This resource provides annotated links to free legal materials for the U.S. federal system, states and territories, and international research.

Public Library of Law (<u>http://www.plol.org/Pages/Search.aspx</u>)

Provides free access to primary sources in U.S. law, including federal and state cases, statutes, regulations, and constitutions. Legal forms are also available which may require an additional fee. The Public Library of Law was created by the makers of Fastcase, and includes links to fee-based content through the Fastcase service.

WashLaw Web (http://www.washlaw.edu)

Large and diverse collection of web links to legal material, maintained by the Washburn School of Law. The information is arranged by jurisdiction and topic.

Free Full-text Online Law Review/Law Journal Search Engine by the American Bar Association (<u>https://www.americanbar.org/groups/departments\_offices/legal\_technology\_resources/resources/resources/free\_journal\_search.html</u>)

This free search engine searches the free full-text of over 300 online law reviews and law journals, as well as document repositories hosting academic papers and related publications such as Congressional Research Service reports. Offered through the ABA.

Government Publishing Office (https://www.gpo.gov/fdsys/)

Access to official Federal Government publications.

Leagle (<u>http://www.leagle.com</u>)

Free site of Every opinion and decision handed down by the Courts – Trial Courts, Appellate Courts and Supreme Courts, spanning Civil, Criminal, Family, Tax or Bankruptcy litigations are published here daily. Library is comprehensive and contains over 5 million published and unpublished cases since 1950.

National Center for State Courts (<u>http://www.ncsc.org</u>)

Several courts provide their own opinions online in PDF form. The directory of State Court Web Sites allows you to search most of them.

USA.gov (https://www.usa.gov)

Search federal and state government websites. A great place to start any research.

Dragnet-New York Law School Library (http://www.nyls.edu/library/library\_services/dragnet1/dragnet/)

Search limited group of law websites, constitutions and codes, and law reviews with online content. This uses a pre-filtered google scholar search to get good results

LexisWeb (http://www.lexisweb.com)

Searches both free legal information and fee-based resources available from LexisNexis. Search results may be limited by filtering options.
